## Douglas College

Douglas College is seeking a Vice-President, Education who will be the academic leader of the College. Douglas College was founded as a two-year community college in 1970 and has since evolved into a comprehensive, four-year institution with an annual operating budget of \$90 million that offers a range of academic opportunities from foundational studies and career programs to four-year degrees (see [www.douglas.ca](http://www.douglas.ca) for more information). The College has two campuses (one in New Westminster and the other in Coquitlam), six training centres across the region, and partner institutions across Canada and the globe. The College's Centre for International Education offers enhanced educational opportunities for both Canadian and international students. A long-time leader in health care education, Douglas College's specialized health care programs are located in a state of the art facility at the Coquitlam campus. The College's excellent reputation

is attributable to the more than 1,100 employees who provide instruction and support services to a diverse population of more than 20,000 students.

As a member of the Senior Management Team reporting to the President, the successful candidate will provide leadership and vision for faculty, staff, and administrators across seven faculties and collaborate with other senior administrators. He or she will lead the development of the academic plan and oversee its implementation and renewal, as well as contribute to other College-wide planning processes. The Vice-President, Education will promote scholarship and enhance the profile of the College both locally and internationally. The successful candidate will have a doctoral degree and preferably five years of senior administrative experience in a public, post-secondary institution. A deep commitment to accessible public education is required, as is experience working with collegial governance and collective agreements.
